Conclave's Overview

The Covid-19 pandemic and a prolong lockdown have severely impacted the lives, livelihood and economy of the country. To overcome these testing times, Hon'ble PM Shri Narendra Modi has come up with "Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan" that aims to foster the local entrepreneurial ecosystem and export potential in India. While relying on self-reliance for realising own actual potential, the Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan is not aimed to lessen India's deep engagement with the rest of the world. In fact, the mission is clearly aimed to open the world of opportunities from India. A special and comprehensive economic package of Rs 20 lakh crore that accounts for 10% of India's GDP, has been announced to bring the economy back on track. Hon'ble Finance Minister Smt Nirmala Sitharaman further announced structural reforms across various sectors to pave the way for Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan.

In this context, the States' Policy Conclave 2020 aspires to support the Prescient Vision and Mission-in-Progress of "Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan" through strengthening the base of government-industry interface under the robust co-operative federalism framework. The Conclave aims to ensure the best desired outcomes in the crucial thrust areas of economy — spanning across Primary, Secondary and Tertiary Sectors.

The conclave's focus on states' reflects few noticeable facts. Since India is best seen not as a single economy but as an aggregation of very different state economies, thus no grand dialogue on macro economy is possible without getting in fold the states' which form the core of competitive federalism. Remarkably, many of the crucial structural reforms in economy are being carried forward by states. Concerning significantly to the Indian economy, the states' have been witnessing major developments in these spheres ranging from social sector to industry and economic growth.

As per an estimate of International Monetary Fund (IMF), the past 26 years have seen the Indian economy grow more than eightfold in dollar terms between 1992 and 2018. A \$293 billion economy 26 years back is a \$2.65 trillion one in 2018. Average incomes have also gone up by a factor of six over the same period – from \$318 to \$1,852. At the cusp of decisive change, if the collaborative efforts of government and industry could continue with the same momentum or increased pace, the next 25 years will end with making India a \$20

trillion economy or even richer where the average Indian citizen would earn $\$7,\!100\,\mathrm{or}\,\mathrm{more}.$

As a major policy traction, the NITI Aayog Action Plan to boost agriculture as well as job creation in modern activities is clearly in sync with what has happened over the past two-and-half decades. In year 2017, the NITI Aayog had set a balanced Action Plan for the next three years – with the 'fair and square' aim to provide a sound strategic support for individual policies listed out in Action Plan. To create the roadmap for future progress, the Action Agenda attempts to cover nearly all aspects of the economy. That is on track of attaining the goals figured out with "Making New India," and the Conclave keeping the constructive bearing with the government and industry, spearheads the Campaign to transform the way India perceives governance and industrial development agenda.

A uniquely significant public policy initiative with focus on government-industry interface in India, the Conclave would support a robust eco-system for businesses, by advocacy for further simplifying the official procedures and making them transparent at decision-making levels with greater interface of technology. Also, it proactively supports India's "Economic Reforms Mission," with bringing the highest echelons of government and industry at one powerful platform where who's who of India makes their presence felt. Since 2014, the economic reforms undertaken at the Centre under the visionary leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi have been "game-changing". Indeed, many promised economic reforms made a way through in recent few years. Noticeably, where the marks were made including, Ease of Doing Business (EoDB), Inflation Control, Fiscal Management, Job Creation, Financial Sector Restructuring, Tax Reforms, Digitisation, Securing Identity with AADHAR, Capacity Building with Energy & Infrastructure, Growth in Services, Revival of Manufacturing and Agri & Allied Sectors; Farm Bill 2020.

This is an era where the performance far exceeds the expectations – and the government-industry collaboration reaching to the next level, for scripting a new chapter for the Indian economy. So, India is already moving on the trajectory which will lead it further to the high and sustained economic growth, and that too, superlatively supported by equity and justice emanated through the grace of its remarkable democracy, positive attributes of federalism and success stories from states. With latest vision, mission and further goals and policies, the states are pushing forth the idea of a government which governs, facilitates and encourages the citizens from diverse stratums to participate in economic development activities. Such a vision necessitates innovative means to achieve the desired ends.

Besides showcasing the Best Practices of different states, the Conclave will also offer a powerful platform for different stakeholders from Central & State Governments, Industry, Policy Establishments, Diplomatic Corps (Embassies & High Commissions), International Agencies & Multilateral Institutions, Investors, Civil Society, Media together for constructive idea-exchanges and policy deliberations. The States' Policy Conclave 2020 opens-up immense opportunities for the participants and partners from both the government and industry sides. With a unique amalgamation, it's going to be the most impactful Policy Conclave of year 2020.
