ONE CHINESE CONTRACTOR REPLACES ANOTHER AT EENHANA

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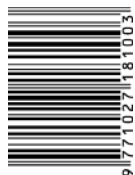
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If the Transport Vote is separated from the rest of the economic cluster, both segments account for less than 21% each – short of the 22% enjoyed by the security cluster.

Despite the unprecedented 42% increase in its N\$3.2-b budget for public works construction in 2024/25, Namibia's central government has again allocated more to defence and security infrastructure than to building facilities in either the education or health and welfare clusters.

The security cluster's N\$706.65-m construction budget accounting for over 22% of the N\$3.2-b total is almost double the health and welfare sector's N\$373.55-m with an 11% share and exceeds the education cluster's N\$578-m accounting for 18%.

If the administrative cluster's construction allocation is added to that of the security apparatus, the social sector's disadvantage worsens.

With a construction budget of N\$227.274-m the administrative cluster accounts for over 7% of the total.

Combined, the administrative and security clusters therefore have almost N\$934-m with which to build government offices, army bases, police stations and prisons, accounting for over 29% of the total.

In comparison, the two social clusters have only a slightly bigger combined N\$951.45-m with which to catch up on the backlog of classrooms, hospitals and clinics, accounting for 29.8%.

This is despite a 68.4% or N\$234.7-m increase in the education cluster's allocation for construction and 44% or N\$114-m increase for the health and welfare cluster, compared to only 25% or N\$140.88-m more for the security cluster. But the administrative cluster's 82% or N\$102.55-m increase is relatively the biggest by far.

The economic cluster's N\$1.3-b budget for construction accounts for the biggest, 41% share of the N\$3.2-b total, following a 37.88% or N\$359.5-m increase over 2023/24's revised construction expenditure.

But if the Transport Vote is separated from the rest of the economic cluster, both segments account for less than 21% each – falling short of the 22% enjoyed by the security cluster.

Comparing previous construction expenditure across clusters

These trends are in line with previous years, when the disparities favouring the security apparatus and the bureaucracy were even greater.

In terms of last year's revised construction expenditure, the security cluster's N\$565.77-m accounted for a bigger 25% share of all N\$2.24-b construction expenditure, compared to the education cluster's N\$343.2-m with only 15% and the health/welfare cluster's N\$259.5-m accounting for 11.57%.

The administrative cluster's N\$124.7-m revised construction expenditure in 2023/24 accounted for only 5.56% of the total compared to this year's 7.12%, which, combined with the security cluster, accounted for over 30%

of the total with N\$690.5-m last year compared to the social sector's 26.88% with a lesser N\$602.7-m – which is not the case this year.

In terms of 2022/23's actual construction expenditure, the administrative and security clusters' combined N\$748-m accounting for 30.8% of the N\$3.6-b total, was more than the social sector's N\$354-m accounting for only 26.88%.

Separating the administrative and security clusters and the two social sector clusters in 2022/23, the security cluster's N\$704.7-m actual expenditure on construction accounting for over 25% exceeded the education cluster's N\$206.58-m accounting for 15% and was also more than the health and welfare cluster's N\$147.38-m accounting for 11.57% of the N\$3.6-b actually spent on construction.

The gap between the security/administrative clusters and the education, health and welfare sectors has therefore narrowed between 2022/23 and this year, but it has not reversed.

The four votes comprising the security cluster are the Defence, Justice, Veterans Affairs and Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security votes.

The education cluster's three votes are Education, Arts & Culture, Sport, Youth & National Service and Higher Education, Technology & Innovation, while the health and welfare cluster consists of two votes – Health & Social Services and Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare.

Of the three clusters – security, education and health/welfare – education is only one supported by foreign funding outside the State Revenue Fund – the N\$1-b AfDB ETQIP loan, some of which is being disbursed in 2024/25 outside the domestically-funded CRI budget inside the State Revenue Fund.

The procurement budget in 2024/25

Within this year's N\$13.495-b procurement budget spread across eight heads of expenditure:

* N\$4.4-b has been voted for materials and supplies in 2024/25, accounting for the biggest, 32.8% of the total, following a N\$722.55-m or 19.6% increase on last year's revised N\$3.68-b expenditure when it accounted for 33.27% of N\$11-b – also the biggest and ahead of construction's N\$2.24-b with only 20%, in third place.

* The N\$3.8-b set aside for other services and expenses accounts for 28% of the procurement total in second place and is 17% or N\$550.6-m more than last year's revised N\$3.25-b expenditure, when it accounted for 29.5% – also in second place and ahead of construction.

* The N\$3.2-b voted for construction, renova-

With its usual biggest allocation for construction, the Transport Vote has N\$663.726-m in 2024/25, accounting for 20.78% of the N\$3.2-b total, following a N\$68-m or 11.4% increase over last year's N\$595.7-m revised CRI expenditure when it accounted for 26.57% of the N\$2.24-b total.

Super share for security

tions and improvements accounts for only 23.7% of the procurement budget in third place amongst eight procurement heads of expenditure and has been surpassed in eight of the past twelve years, despite a 42.45% or N\$951.7-m increase over last year's N\$2.24-b when it accounted for only 20% of the N\$11-b total – its lowest share since 2013/14 and also in third place. This is also the second consecutive year that the budget for public works is less than that for the procurement of materials and supplies as well as for other services and expenses, both of which are heads of current expenditure that do not add value.

* In its usual fourth place, accounting for 7.77% of the procurement total, a little over N\$1.48-b has been voted for operational equipment, machinery and plant – exceeding N\$1-b for the second consecutive year, following a 4.34% or N\$47.586-m reduction on last year's N\$1.1-b revised expenditure.

* A little below N\$500-m has been voted for feasibility studies, design and supervision in its usual fifth place out of eight procurement heads, accounting for 3.7% of the procurement budget – the highest FSDS budget since 2013/14, following a 34% or N\$126.6-m increase over last year's N\$373.3-m revised expenditure.

The economic cluster has the biggest share of 2024/25's N\$3.2-b CRI budget, with N\$1.3-b accounting for 40.6% of the total, following a N\$359.5-m or 37.88% increase over last year's N\$949-m revised expenditure when it accounted for 42.36% of the N\$2.24-b total.

* The budget for acquiring new vehicles has hit a multi-year high in 2024/25 with N\$285.5-m, accounting for a little over 2% of all voted procurement expenditure in sixth place following a 7.6% or N\$20.17-m increase over last year's N\$265.3-m revised spending.

* Again in seventh and second-last place, N\$197.7-m has been voted for furniture and office equipment (including ICT) – the highest in the past eight years, accounting for 1.46% of the procurement total, following a N\$42.7-m or 27.5% increase over last year's revised N\$155-m expenditure.

* N\$68.265-m has been voted for the purchase of buildings, accounting for 0.5% of the procurement total in its traditional eighth and last place, following a colossal N\$64.265-m or 1.606% increase on last year's N\$4-m expenditure – double the N\$2-m initially voted.

Construction budgets across clusters in 2024/25

As was the case last year, ranked second after the economic sector, the security cluster's budget for construction, renovations and improvements is not only higher than the education (ranked third) and health/welfare (ranked fourth and second-last) clusters, but also surpasses the administrative cluster and the economic cluster – excluding the Transport Vote, which it also

exceeds for the first time.

* If one separates the Transport Vote from the rest of the economic cluster, the security cluster has the upper hand in 2024/25's construction budget.

It nearest rival is the Transport Vote, whose N\$663.7 CRI budget accounts for 20.78% of the N\$3.2-b total – less than security's N\$706.65-m with over 22%.

Transport accounts for over 51% of the economic cluster's entire N\$1.3-b ceiling for construction, renovations and improvements, leaving N\$644.8-m for the rest of the cluster – each accounting for a little over 20% of the total CRI budget.

Last year, Transport's colossal N\$1.58-b or 72.5% reduction in revised expenditure on its N\$2.187-b actual CRI expenditure in 2022/23 exceeded the entire N\$1.4-b lower revised CRI expenditure in 2023/24.

On its own, the Transport Vote accounted for 16% of 2023/24's N\$2.24-b revised CRI expenditure, compared to 60.5% of 2022/23's actual N\$3.6-b total.

Because of the huge reduction in the Transport Vote's construction budget in 2023/24, the economic cluster's share of the national total as a whole fell from 69% the previous year to 42% – all in first place.

The security cluster's N\$565.77-m revised CRI expenditure in 2023/24, was behind the Transport Vote's N\$595.7-m but N\$212.5-m or 60% more than the rest of the economic cluster's N\$353.275-m, compared to this year, when security's N\$706.65-m allocation is only N\$61.85-m or 9.6% more.

* The economic cluster as a whole has the biggest share of 2024/25's N\$3.2-b CRI budget, with N\$1.3-b accounting for 40.6% of the total, following a N\$359.5-m or 37.88% increase over last year's N\$949-m revised expenditure when it accounted for 42.36% of the N\$2.24-b total.

This was a significant 62% or N\$1.55-b reduction on 2022/23's N\$2.5-b actual expenditure accounting for 69% of the N\$3.6-b total.

* The education cluster has the third-biggest CRI budget in 2024/25 with N\$577.9-m accounting for 18% of the N\$3.2-b total, following a 68.4% or N\$234.7-m increase over last year's N\$343.2-m revised expenditure when it accounted for 15.3% of the N\$2.24-b total.

Its revised CRI expenditure in 2023/24 was N\$136.6-m or 66% more than 2022/23's actual N\$206.58-m, accounting for only 5.7% of N\$3.6-b actual construction expenditure total.

* In fourth place, the health and welfare cluster has N\$373.55-m to spend

on construction projects in 2024/25 accounting for 11.7% of the total, following a 44% or N\$114-m increase over last year's revised N\$259.5-m expenditure when it accounted for a similar 11.57% of the total.

This followed a significant N\$112.5-m or 131% increase over 2022/23's actual N\$147.38-m actual CRI expenditure accounting for only 4%.

The two other votes in the health and welfare cluster – as usual – again do not feature significantly in 2024/25's budget for construction:

* Vote 14 - Labour, Industrial Relations & Employment Creation's N\$6-m is N\$1.5-m more than its revised N\$4.5-m CRI expenditure in 2023/24, which was almost N\$2-m more than 2022/23's actual N\$3.547-m spending;

* Vote 36 - Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare's N\$10.3-m is N\$6.48-m less than 2023/24's N\$16.78-m revised CRI expenditure, which was N\$7.65-m more than 2022/23's actual N\$9-m.

* Fifth and last, the administrative cluster's N\$227.27-m budget for construction in 2024/25 accounts for 7% of the total following a huge N\$102.55-m or 82% increase over last year's N\$124.7-m revised CRI expenditure when it accounted for 5.56% of the total.

This was a huge N\$81.45-m or 188.35% increase over 2022/23's N\$43.246-m actual CRI expenditure accounting for a mere 1.2% of the total.

Previous construction expenditure by clusters

The security cluster's actual N\$558-m CRI expenditure in 2021/22 was 3.5% lower than 2020/21's actual N\$575-m, following a 34.66% decline from N\$880-m actual expenditure in 2019/20.

With the second-biggest share of the CRI budgets in most years, (after the economic cluster), the security cluster's N\$558.6-m expenditure on construction translated into a 17.5% share of 2021/22's N\$3.2-b actual expenditure, despite its decrease over 2020/21, when it accounted for 14.4% of the N\$3.98-b total, compared to its 22.2% share with N\$880.2-m out of N\$3.96-b in 2019/20.

* The education cluster's actual N\$527.8-m CRI expenditure in 2021/22 (still behind security) was massively higher than 2020/21's actual N\$120-m expenditure (a 134% increase) and almost half 2019/20's N\$232.37-m actual expenditure.

* The health and welfare cluster's actual N\$253.576-m CRI expenditure in 2021/22 was significantly higher than 2020/21's actual N\$212-m expenditure - a 46% increase over 2019/20's N\$145.34-m actual expenditure.

* The administrative cluster's N\$97-m actual CRI expenditure in 2021/22 was marginally lower than 2020/21's N\$102.5-m - almost double 2019/20's N\$56.7-m actual expenditure.

* With the economic cluster's traditional biggest share of the construction budget – most of it attributable to the Transport Vote – the economic cluster's N\$1.75-b actual CRI expenditure in 2021/22 was almost 60% less than 2020/21's actual N\$2.97-b-m expenditure when it accounted for 74.58% of the N\$3.98-b total, compared to its 66.88% share with N\$2.645-b out of N\$3.96-b in 2019/20.

Votes with construction budgets this year

Of the 23 votes out of 33 with allocations for construction, renovations and improvements in 2024/25 (22 last year), nine have allocations exceeding N\$100-m, compared to five last year, six in 2022/23, five in 2021/22, eight in 2020/21, nine

in 2019/20 and ten in 2018/19.

These declines are all a clear reflection of the public construction sector's demise in terms of domestically-financed government investment - excluding foreign grants and loans.

A further six votes have over N\$50-m to spend on construction in 2024/25, compared to seven last year, only three in 2022/23 and one in 2021/22.

Of this year's 23 votes with CRI allocations, only two are lower than the previous year's revised expenditure (compared to five last year) – the biggest reduction of which is that of the Gender Equality, Poverty Eradication & Social Welfare Vote.

Transport

With its usual biggest allocation for construction, renovations and improvements, Transport (Vote 24) has N\$663.726-m in 2024/25, accounting for 20.78% of the N\$3.2-b total, following a N\$68-m or 11.4% increase over last year's N\$595.7-m revised CRI expenditure when it accounted for 26.57% of the N\$2.24-b total.

Its revised expenditure last year followed a dramatic N\$1.584-b or 72.68% drop on 2022/23's N\$2.18-b actual expenditure when it accounted for a much higher 60.5% of all N\$3.6-b construction expenditure.

Home Affairs & Immigration, Safety & Security has the third-biggest construction budget in 2024/25 with N\$385.55-m accounting for 12% of the total, following a marginal N\$5-m or 1.3% increase on its N\$380.47-m revised expenditure last year accounting for a much higher 17%.

Transport's N\$1.584-b lower revised construction expenditure in 2023/24 exceeded the entire N\$1.362-b overall lower CRI spending across all votes.

This all excludes foreign loans outside the State Revenue Fund.

Transport started 2021/22 with N\$1.487-b, accounting for 47.6% of the initial N\$3.12-b CRI total, following a N\$51-m or 3.3% reduction on 2020/21's actual N\$1.5-b when it accounted for 38.57% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total – a 2.2% or N\$34.88-m reduction on 2019/20's actual N\$1.57-b expenditure when it accounted for 39.7% or the N\$3.96-b CRI total.

Education, Arts & Culture

Vote 10 has the second-biggest budget for construction in 2024/25, after lying third over the previous two years behind Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security.

Its N\$453.9-m CRI budget this year accounts for 14.2% of the total following a dramatic N\$160.7-m or 54.8% increase over last year's N\$293.2-m revised expenditure accounting for 13% of the total.

Its revised expenditure last year was N\$98.5-m or 50.6% more than its N\$194.65-m actual CRI expenditure in 2022/23 when it accounted for only 5.4% of the total.

This was the same as its original allocation in 2022/23, following a severe 26% or N\$68.435-m reduction on 2021/22's N\$264-m actual expenditure, when it accounted for a much higher 8.28% of the N\$3-b total.

Its actual CRI expenditure in 2021/22 was slightly below its initial N\$265.9-m, which was a huge N\$160.475-m or 152.2% increase on 2020/21's actual N\$105.43-m when it accounted for only 2.64% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total in sixth place, following a 53.6% or N\$121.86-m reduction on 2019/20's actual N\$227.3-m expenditure, accounting for 2.64% of

the N\$3.96-b CRI total in eighth place.

Vote 10's N\$105.43-m actual expenditure in 2020/21 was a severe downgrade of the N\$159.4-m originally voted - already a sharp 33.4% or N\$80-m reduction from 2019/20's actual N\$239.48-m actual expenditure when it accounted for 5.4% of the N\$4.445-b national CRI total in a higher, fifth ranking.

Vote 10's accompanying vote – Higher Education (Vote 32) – again has no allocation for construction in 2024/25, as has been the case over the past nine years.

This is because the various tertiary education SOEs in this sector are supported through capital transfers from the finance ministry.

Home Affairs & Immigration, Safety & Security

Falling from its second place over the previous two years, Vote 39 has the third-biggest CRI budget in 2024/25, with N\$385.55-m accounting for 12% of the total, following a marginal N\$5-m or 1.3% increase on its N\$380.47-m revised construction expenditure last year accounting for a much higher 17% of the total – consider-

ably lower than its N\$403.85-m allocation at the beginning of 2023/24.

Its revised CRI expenditure last year was N\$139.655-m or 26.85% less than its N\$520-m actual expenditure in 2022/23 when it accounted for 14.4% of the total - a generous N\$167.45-m or 47.5% increase on 2021/22's actual N\$352.55-m expenditure accounting for 11% of the N\$3-b total.

Vote 39 had a much lower N\$341.55-m CRI budget at the start of 2021/22 – N\$19.2-m or 5.3% less than 2020/21's actual N\$360.76-m expenditure for the former separate votes of Home Affairs and Safety & Security, accounting for 9% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total, which had been N\$184.2-m or 33.76% less than 2019/20's N\$545-m actual expenditure when they accounted for 13.76% of the N\$3.96-b CRI total.

Vote 39's post-midyear additional allocation in 2021/22 was for additional funding with which to complete its new head office.

When Safety & Security and Home Affairs & Immigration were separate votes

Safety & Security (the now defunct Vote 6) had the fourth-biggest CRI allocation in 2020/21, with actual expenditure of N\$294.2-m accounting for 7.38% of the N\$3.987-b total, following a 21.7% reduction on 2019/20's actual N\$375.7-m expenditure, accounting for 9.5% of the N\$3.96-b total.

Notably, however, the former Vote 6's 2020/21 CRI funding outranked each one of the education cluster's votes by far, as well as each of the health and welfare cluster's votes – in spite of its reduced CRI allocation from the previous year. Vote 6 was ranked second in 2019/20.

Prior to its absorption in the new Vote 39, Home Affairs & Immigration (Vote 5)'s N\$66.5-m actual expenditure in 2020/21 accounting for 1.67% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total was a 60.7% or N\$102.7-m reduction on 2019/20's actual N\$169.256-m when it accounted for 4.27% of the N\$3.96-b total.

Its actual 2020/21 expenditure of N\$66.5-m resulted from a drastic 26% or N\$23.5-m midyear cutback from N\$90-m allocated at the beginning of the year, its share of all CRI expenditure falling from 2.2% to 1.65%.

This must have had mostly to do with the near-completion of its gigantic new head office in Windhoek (awarded to a Chinese contractor without public tender), its ranking plunging from seventh in 2019/20 to tenth in 2020/21.

Health & Social Services

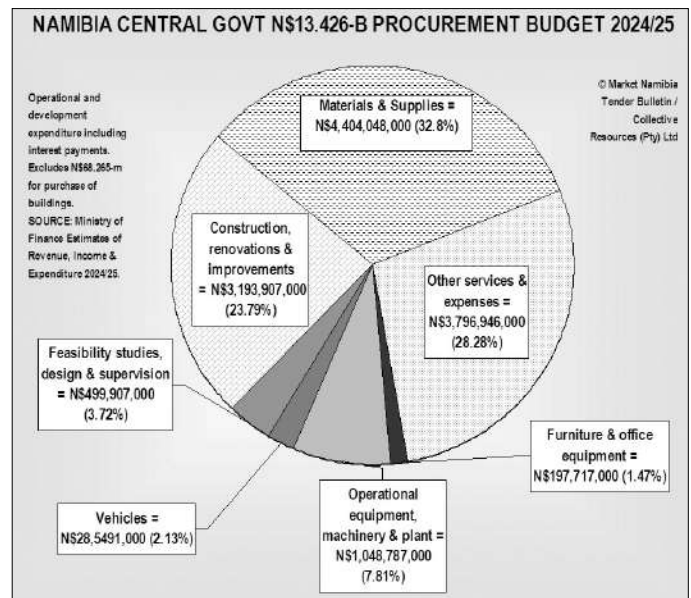
Health & Social Services (Vote 13) again has the fourth-biggest construction allocation in 2024/25 as it did last year, with N\$357.25-m accounting for 11.2% of the total, following a near-50% or N\$119-m increase over its N\$238.237-m revised expenditure in 2023/24 when it enjoyed a 10.6% share – slightly more than the N\$228.25-m with which it started the year.

Its revised expenditure on construction in 2023/24 was an enormous 75.56% or N\$102.5-m increase over 2022/23's N\$135.7-m actual spending, with a much lower 3.76% share of the total.

This was lower than the N\$160.955-m initially allocated in 2022/23, following a 33% or N\$79.568-m reduction on

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Health & Social Services has the fourth-biggest construction allocation in 2024/25 with N\$357.25-m accounting for 11.2% of the total, following a near-50% or N\$119-m increase over its N\$238.237-m revised expenditure in 2023/24 when it enjoyed a 10.6% share.



Defence is in fifth place, with N\$250-m to spend on construction accounting for 7.8% of the total, following a 37.5% or N\$68.2-m increase over last year's N\$181.80-m revised CRI expenditure accounting for over 8%.

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2021/22's actual N\$240.5-m expenditure, when it accounted for a much higher 7.5% of the N\$3-b total.

Vote 13's actual expenditure in 2021/22 was also significantly lower than its initial N\$265-m ceiling at the beginning of the year, which had been a considerable 41% or N\$77.2-m increase over 2020/21's actual N\$187.85-m in fifth place, following a 34.3% or N\$47.95-m increase over 2019/20's actual N\$140-m expenditure in seventh place.

In 2020/21, Vote 13's initial N\$209.3-m CRI allocation was a 16.7% or nearly N\$30-m more than 2019/20's actual N\$179.3-m, before it was reduced by 10.26% or N\$21.47-m to N\$187.85-m midyear.

In 2019/20, Vote 13 was amongst the worst-affected when its initial N\$296-m allocation for construction, renovations and improvements was reduced by 48.5% or N\$143.7-m to N\$152.5-m midyear, is share of the overall CRI budget dropping from 5.65% in sixth place to 3.4% in eighth place.

Defence

Defence (Vote 8) is again in fifth place as it was last year, with N\$250-m to spend on construction accounting for 7.8% of the total, following a 37.5% or N\$68.2-m increase over last year's N\$181.80-m revised CRI expenditure accounting for over 8% - a little more than the N\$180-m with which it started out.

Its revised 2023/24 expenditure was a marginal N\$650,235 or 0.36% less than its N\$182.45-m actual CRI spending in 2022/23 with a much lower 5% share.

This was a lot higher than its N\$151-m allocated at the beginning of 2022/23, just behind Health & Social Services in fifth place - up from the previous year's initial seventh place.

This N\$151-m allocated at the beginning 2022/23 followed a 1.75% or N\$2.6-m increase on 2021/22's actual N\$148.4-m expenditure, consuming 4.66% of the CRI total - lower than its initial N\$150.9-m in 2021/22, when it accounted for 4.8% of the N\$3-b CRI total in sixth place.

Administrative cluster's construction budget up by

Its actual expenditure in 2020/21 was 36% or N\$84.27-m below 2019/20's actual N\$234.27-m when it accounted for a higher 5.9% of the N\$3.96-b total in an even higher fourth place.

Mines & Energy

Vote 15 has been elevated from last year's eleventh to sixth place in 2024/25's CRI budget rankings, with N\$137.8-m accounting for 4.3% of the total, following a huge 219% or N\$94.6-m increase over last year's N\$43.2-m revised expenditure consuming a little below 2% of the total - less than its N\$58-m initial allocation.

Vote 15's revised CRI expenditure last year was another huge 129% or N\$24.34-m increase over 2022/23's N\$18.8-m actual expenditure consuming only 0.5% of the total.

This was the same as its initial allocation at the beginning of 2022/23, following a 42.6% or N\$18.2-m reduction on its N\$42.7-m actual expenditure in 2021/22 with a 1.46% share - significantly lower than its N\$51-m allocation at the beginning of 2021/22, following a 10.88% or N\$5-m increase on 2020/21's actual N\$46-m, which had been a considerable 131.7% or N\$26.2-m

increase over 2019/20's N\$19.985-m actual expenditure.

Mines & Energy's initial N\$59-m CRI budget in 2020/21 was reduced by 22.7% to N\$45.6-m midyear - still double its N\$23-m actual expenditure in 2019/20.

Works

Vote 23 retains its seventh place that came out of nowhere last year, with N\$147.7-m to spend on construction in 2024/25 accounting for 4.6% of the total, following a near-doubling of its N\$74.185-m revised expenditure last year consuming 3.3% of the total - considerably more than its initial N\$88.185-m allocation.

Its revised CRI spending in 2023/24 was a massive 526% or N\$62.3-m increase over 2022/23's N\$11.85-m actual expenditure, when it had an insignificant ranking - less than half its N\$25.4-m actual expenditure in 2021/22.

Youth, Sport & National Service

Thanks to its N\$74-m additional CRI allocation of N\$124-m with which to push ahead on the upgrade of

82% to N\$227.27-m - the biggest relative growth

Independence Stadium (for which no public tender has been issued), Vote 27's ranking has been elevated to eighth in 2024/25, accounting for 3.88% of the total, following its 148% increase over last year's N\$50-m revised expenditure when it consumed 2.2% of the total in ninth place - much lower than its N\$70-m initial allocation in 2023/24. This lower expenditure resulted from the stalled Independence Stadium upgrade tendering process.

Its disappointing revised construction spending last year was a whopping 319% or N\$38-m more than its actual N\$12-m expenditure in 2022/23.

This was after its N\$66-m CRI allocation at the beginning of 2022/23 accounting for 1.97% of the N\$3.34-b total in seventh place was slashed midway by N\$43-m - again because of the stalled stadium upgrade.

The original N\$66-m allocation had been a breathtaking 482.58% increase on its N\$11.33-m actual CRI expenditure in 2021/22 when it consumed only 0.4% of the N\$3-b total.

N\$50-m of this N\$66-m allocation at the beginning of last year was earmarked for the rehabilitation of the Independence Stadium in Windhoek - only half the N\$98-m the ministry needs to bring it in line with international football governing body, FIFA's standards to be able to host international matches.

Prior to 2022/23, the Ministry of Youth, Sport & National Service featured much lower in the distribution of construction expenditure.

Its actual N\$11.33-m CRI expenditure in 2021/22 was below its initial N\$15.43-m allocation at the beginning of the year, which had been 6.4% or N\$929,000 more than its N\$14.5-m in 2020/21.

This, in turn, had been a whopping 185.4% or N\$9.4-m increase over 2019/20's actual N\$5-m CRI expenditure.

Agriculture & Land Reform

Vote 37 remains in ninth place, with N\$116.74-m to spend on construction in 2024/25, accounting for 3.66% of the total following a generous 59.3% or N\$43.47-m increase over last year's revised N\$73.27-m CRI expenditure accounting for 3.27% - slightly short of its N\$75.77-m initial allocation.

Vote 37's revised CRI expenditure in 2023/24 was almost N\$18-m or 32.38% more than its actual N\$55.35-m spending in 2022/23 with only a 1.5% share.

This was unchanged from its allocation at the beginning of 2022/23, following a steep 51.78% or N\$61.687-m decrease on 2021/22's actual N\$119-m expenditure when it accounted for a much higher 4% share of the N\$3-b total in fifth place.

Its N\$119-m CRI expenditure in 2021/22 was considerably lower than its initial N\$165.235-m ceiling.

This, in turn, had been N\$4.7-m or 2.77% less than 2020/21's actual N\$170-m, when it accounted for 4.26% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total in sixth place.

But these CRI allocations exclude the Water component, that was split off from the previous Vote 10 - Agriculture, Water & Forestry - in 2020/21 (when Vote 10 became defunct).

Combining the CRI allocations of the two votes (and ignoring the 'forestry' function that was combined with the Tourism Vote at the same time), the expenditures in 2020/21 and the previous year were roughly in line with the former Agriculture, Water & Forestry (Vote 20)'s 18.85% share with N\$746.68-m of 2019/20's N\$3.96-b actual CRI expenditure.

Ignoring the 'forestry' function, the combined construction budgets of the new Agriculture & Land Reform (Vote 37) and Water (Vote 38) in their first year in 2020/21, amounted to N\$859.4-m, accounting for just below 20% of the N\$4.1-b overall construction total at the beginning of the year.

Vote 37 is the last one with over N\$100-m to spend on construction projects in 2024/25.

Water

Ranked tenth (sixth last year), the Water Vote again has the biggest CRI allocation between N\$50-m and N\$100-m as was the case last year, with a budget of N\$85.787-m accounting for 2.7% of the total, following a 20.3% or N\$14.477-m increase over last year's N\$71.3-m revised expenditure when it consumed over 3% of the total - considerably less than its initial N\$93.8-m allocation.

Vote 38's revised CRI expenditure in 2023/24 was 45.47% or N\$59.46-m less than the N\$130.77-m actually spent in 2022/23 when it accounted for 3.6% of the total, also in sixth place and a little more than its N\$125.8-m ceiling at the beginning of that year.

This N\$125.8-m actual CRI spending in 2022/23 saw it plunge from second place in its first year as a separate vote in 2021/22 - probably because the AfDB's N\$1.893-b loan plus a N\$54-m grant for Namibia's 'Water Sector Support Program' kicked in the following, resulting in lowered domestic funding for the water sector.

Its N\$125.825-m CRI expenditure in 2022/23 followed a 302% or N\$94.5-m increase over the previous year's N\$31.3-m actual expenditure, when it consumed only 0.98% of the N\$3-b total.

This was slightly lower than the N\$33-m it was allocated at the beginning of 2021/22, accounting for 1.06% of the N\$3.1-b CRI total in tenth place, following a 95% or N\$656.3-m reduction on 2020/21's actual N\$689.44-m expenditure when it accounted for 17.3% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total in second place behind only the Transport Vote.

Its initial N\$649-m allocation in 2020/21 was supplemented midway with a further N\$40-m for Covid-19 containment facilities.

Environment, Forestry & Tourism

Ranked eleventh, Vote 18 has a N\$76.78-m CRI ceiling in 2024/25 accounting for 2.4%, following a generous 85.8% or N\$35.46-m increase over last year's N\$41.3-m revised expenditure with a 1.8% share - slightly less than its initial N\$44.3-m CRI budget.

This revised expenditure last year was an enormous 135% or N\$23.75-m increase over 2022/23's N\$17.56-m actual expenditure accounting for less than a half percent of the total - short of its N\$19.75-m allocation at the beginning of 2022/23, following a severe 50.7% or N\$20.3-m reduction on its actual N\$40-m expenditure in 2021/22.

Vote 18's actual expenditure then was considerably lower than its initial N\$57.586-m allocation in 2021/22, which was N\$14.6-m or 20.22% less than 2020/21's actual N\$72.2-m.

The more than doubling of its initial allocation in 2020/21 was N\$39.4-m or 120.4% more than 2019/20's N\$32.75-m actual expenditure.

Vote 18's much higher initial CRI allocation in 2020/21 was probably due to the addition of the forestry function it took over from Agriculture, Water & Forestry that year.

Thanks to its N\$74-m additional CRI allocation of N\$124-m with which to push ahead on the upgrade of Independence Stadium, Youth, Sport & National Service accounts for 3.88% of the total, following its 148% increase over last year's N\$50-m revised expenditure.

The presidency

Ranked twelfth, the Office of the President (Vote 1) has N\$66-m to spend on construction in 2024/25 with a 2.07% share of the total, following a marginal 3% or N\$2.1-m increase over last year's N\$64-m revised CRI spending with a 2.85% share - far below its N\$83-m initial allocation in 2023/24 in eighth place.

Its revised expenditure last year was 72% or N\$26.8-m more than 2022/23's N\$37.2-m actual expenditure consuming only 1% of the total - also short of the N\$41-m allocation at the beginning of the year, following a generous 57% or N\$15-m increase over 2021/22's actual N\$26-m expenditure, below its initial N\$32.3-m ceiling, which had been N\$9-m or 38.4% more than 2020/21's actual N\$23.356-m - a generous 133.56% or N\$13.356-m more than 2019/20's N\$10-m actual expenditure.

Justice

In thirteenth place, Vote 16 has N\$65.9-m to spend on construction in 2024/25 accounting for 2.06% of the total - a 100% increase on its nil revised expenditure last year - from N\$43.7-m voted at the beginning of 2023/24, which had almost doubled its revised N\$22.3-m expenditure in 2022/23 - also since changed to nil actual expenditure.

Its initial allocation in 2022/23 followed a 55.46% or N\$27.8-m reduction on its N\$50-m actual expenditure in 2021/22, following a reduction on 2020/21's actual N\$59.3-m.

This was 36.35% or N\$33.858-m less than 2019/20's actual N\$93.17-m expenditure.

These falling allocations for construction were probably in line with the winding up of the Supreme Court building upgrade in Windhoek, with this year's fresh allocation needed to upgrade the ministry's Justitia Building head office.

Information & Communication Technology

Ranked fourteenth, Vote 29's has N\$60-m to spend on construction in 2024/25 accounting for 1.88% of the total, following a huge 500% or N\$50-m increase on its insignificant N\$10-m revised expenditure last year, which had been a N\$9.4-m or 1.637% increase over its N\$575,581 actual expenditure in 2022/23.

Industrialisation & Trade

As was the case over the previous two years, Vote 19 is the last of the votes with a significant allocation for construction in 2024/25, with N\$50-m accounting for 1.57% in fifteenth place, following a N\$16-m or 47% increase on last year's N\$34-m revised CRI expenditure accounting for 1.52%.

This had been 54% or N\$40.56-m less than 2022/23's N\$74.56-m actual expenditure accounting for 2.07% of the total - considerably more than its initial N\$54-m ceiling at the start of 2022/23, following a 19.75% increase on 2021/22's actual N\$45-m expenditure.

This actual expenditure in 2021/22 was lower than its initial N\$47.6-m allocation, which was N\$5.6-m or 13.3% more than 2020/21's actual N\$42-m, which had been 55.44% below 2019/20's actual N\$94.3-m.

The rest

That leaves two votes with over 1% of 2024/25's N\$3.2-b budget for construction, renovations and improvements:

* Office of the Prime Minister (Vote 2) with N\$41.174-m accounting for 1.29%, following a generous 620% or N\$35.455-m increase over last year's N\$5.7-m expenditure, which had been almost 13,200% more than its negligible 43,034 actual CRI expenditure in


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Agriculture & Land Reform has N\$116.74-m to spend on construction in 2024/25, accounting for 3.66% of the total following a generous 59.3% or N\$43.47-m increase over last year's revised N\$73.27-m accounting for 3.27%.

2022/23; and

* International Relations & Cooperation (Vote 7), with N\$40-m accounting for 1.25%, following an 11% or N\$5-m reduction on last year's N\$45-m – more than its initial N\$42-m CRI. Its revised CRI spending last year was 860% or N\$40.3-m more than 2022/23's N\$4.7-m actual expenditure – considerably below its N\$36.3-m initial allocation, following a generous 95% or N\$17.7-m increase over 2021/22's N\$18.6-m actual spending, compared to 2020/21's N\$19-m and 2019/20's actual N\$8.3-m expenditure.

Still no Urban & Rural Development

This is the fourth consecutive year out of several, that Vote 17 has no budget for construction, renovations and improvements, which means there are no transfers through this vote to local and regional councils for housing infrastructure, but through the finance ministry instead. Vote 17 last recorded actual CRI

Mines & Energy's budget for construction up by 219% to N\$1378-m

The Water Vote has N\$85.787-m for construction, accounting for 2.7% of the total, following a 20.3% or N\$14.477-m increase over last year's N\$71.3-m revised expenditure when it consumed over 3%.

expenditure of N\$4-m in 2021/22, according to 2022/23's budget book – up from a nil allocation at the beginning of the year.

But 2021/22's sudden and complete disappearance of a CRI budget initially came after Vote 17 ended 2020/21 with an actual N\$407-m expenditure on construction, accounting for 10.21% of the N\$3.987-b CRI total in third place.

This, in turn, had been a 138.5% or N\$236.3-m increase over 2019/20's N\$170.66-m actual expenditure, when it accounted for 4.3% of the N\$3.96-b total in sixth place.

Its initial N\$417.5-m allocation at the beginning of 2020/21 was 4.65%

or N\$20.357-m less than 2019/20's revised N\$437.857-m – since grossly restated as only N\$170.66-m in 2021/22's budget book.

Urban & Rural Development had no budget for construction in 2016/17, 2015/16 or 2014/15.

All those years of zero allocations for public housing services infrastructure were supposed to be filled through municipal budgets, but degenerated into localized patronage networks enriching connected property developers instead of delivering affordable housing for low-income residents.

ONE CHINESE CONTRACTOR REPLACES ANOTHER AT EENHANA

5 JULY 2024

The Central Procurement Board of Namibia on 08-Apr-24 re-awarded a tender for the construction of the Ohangwena Regional Council's new offices at Eenhana to China Jiangxi International in joint venture with New Success Investments for N\$232.3-m, after having awarded the contract to another partnership between Jiangsu Zhengtai Construction and IBuild Supplies for N\$234.4-m in February.

When tender W/ONB/CPBN-03/2023 for the construction of Ohangwena Regional Council offices at Eenhana closed 25-Oct-23, it attracted sixteen offers from N\$232.3-m to N\$266.7-m that included twelve Chinese contractors in joint ventures, as reported in *Tender Bulletin 1520*.

The CPB's cost estimate for the project is N\$254,139,593 including VAT.

The first award was published in *Tender Bulletin 1529*, based on an award notice on the CPB's website dated 24-Jan-24, with the successful bidder announced as:

* IBuild Supplies / Jiangsu Zhengtai Construction Group Namibia JV = N\$234,369,722.85 for a 36-month contract duration.

The reconsideration of the award was published in terms of Section 55(4A) of the Public Procurement Act.

Contract for Ohangwena Regional Council's new offices re-awarded to a different Chinese joint venture, reducing the cost from N\$234.4-m to N\$232.3-m – still well below the Central Procurement Board's N\$254.1-m cost estimate

The new contractor's offer is lower than the previous amount awarded.

In January the CPB Bid Evaluation Committee regarded the N\$232,314,439.40 offer of New Success Investments / China Jiangxi International JV as non-responsive, because the BSc in civil engineering honours for JS Amukalu was stamped, but not signed by a Commissioner of Oaths.

It is not clear why the CPB's rejection was reversed, but the new joint venture was now ranked first of the seven responsive offers and the Jiangsu / IBuild JV second.

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WAR VETS REHAB CENTRE PAST ITS SELL-BY DATE

5 JULY 2024

The Namibian government has abandoned its plans to build a rehabilitation centre for war veterans of the liberation struggle on land that was donated by the Omusati Regional Council to the Ministry of Defence & Veterans Affairs.

The land in Epalela was fenced off during the 2014/15 financial year, but the plan for a rehabilitation centre is no longer viable, because the war vets are now ageing and becoming physically frail.

Government has started turning the land into a horticulture project instead, since it is close to the Etaka Dam. The proceeds from this project will be used to supplement the Veterans Fund, according to a statement by the Ministry.

During the 2023/24 financial year an irrigation system was installed and 144 citrus trees were planted [for which again no public tenders were issued, according to the *Tender Bulletin* database].

During the 2014/15 financial year N\$66-m was budgeted for a leisure and rehabilitation facility, to give registered war veterans of the liberation struggle access to leisure activities, palliative care and psycho-social and physiotherapy services (*Die Republikein* 22-

Government plans to build a rehab centre for Swapo's war vets are no longer viable, so a horticultural project has been launched on land donated by the Omusati Regional Council instead – work on which is proceeding without public tender

May-24; *Namibian Sun* 21-May-24).

No budget for N\$66-m war vets centre in 2018

In 2018 the N\$66-m leisure and rehabilitation facility meant for war veterans in Epalela in the Omusati Region, was lying idle because of budgetary constraints after the project began in 2014/15. A year later a guardhouse and two chalets had been built, after which there have been no construction activities.

Even registered war veterans have questioned the need for the facility catering for leisure activities, palliative care and psychological and physiotherapy services for ageing ex-Swapo fighters.

President of the Namibian National Liberation Veterans Association at the time, Ben Shikongo, said he was not consulted and only heard about the project through the grapevine (*Namibian Sun* 05-Mar-18, *Tender Bulletin* 1243).

Project total flip-flops from N\$66-m to N\$573-m

There has never been a public tender for this project since it began, according to the *Tender Bulletin's* database.

But government-funded Veteran Affairs Project 31/04/10 under NPC Code 18353 for the construction of veterans recreational facilities at Onesi in the Omusati Region has appeared on several development budgets with project totals changing from N\$66-m in 2014 to N\$108-m in 2017, N\$3740-m in 2018 and N\$573-m in 2021:

* The 2016/17 budget listed the project summary for 2014/15 as the construction of recreational facilities and M&E. In 2015/16, eighteen chalets were supposed to be built in Omusati Region with a midyear reduction from N\$8.124-m by N\$2,669,382, when the project totaled N\$108-m and N\$5.454-m had been budgeted for construction.

* During 2017/18, N\$2.99-m was budgeted for Phase 2 of the chalets construction, when the total project value was N\$369.73-m.

* In 2020/21 the project for 'counselling and rehabilitating traumatized veterans as well as redirecting their "thing" [thinking] and changing their mindset on other social aspects of the country' included finalise fencing Plot A, install kitchenettes, doors, windows, construct septic tank and finalise the master plan. The project total at this stage was N\$573.375-m, but only N\$572,000 was budgeted, with midyear revisions not disclosed.

* In 2023/24 the construction of veterans recreation reported that in the previous year "no activities undertaken due to zero budget."

* The project was last active in 2017/18 when the agenda was still the construction of chalets for Phase 2.

Purported previous expenditure until 2021/22 was reported as N\$656,000 when N\$1-m was voted in 2023/24 (*Tender Bulletin* database).

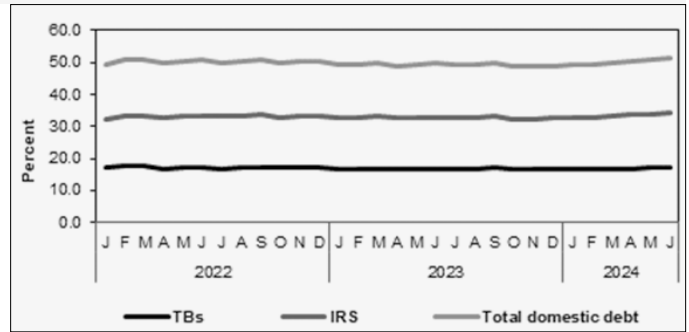
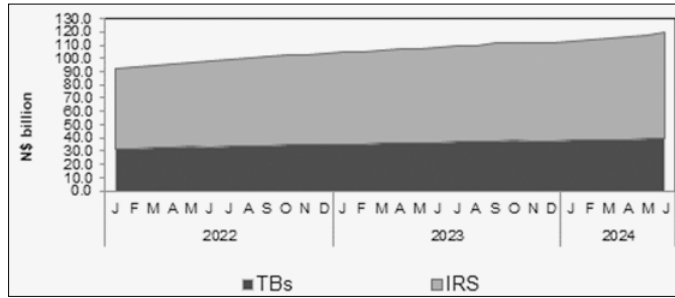
NAM'S DOMESTIC GOVERNMENT DEBT UP 10.7% TO N\$119.5-B

5 JULY 2024

Namibia's domestic government grew to N\$119.5-b during June, according to the Bank of Namibia's latest monthly report – up 1.9% on the previous month and 10.7% annualized.

The increase was reflected in both Treasury Bills and Internal Registered Stock, which rose by 2.2% and 1.7% to N\$40.1-b and N\$79.4-b respectively.

On an annual basis, the issuance of TBs increased 9.9% and IRS by



11.1%.

As percentage of GDP, domestic debt increased to 51.3% by 0.4 percentage point month-on-month and by 1.7

percentage points year-on-year, reflecting increased ratios of both IRS and TBs to GDP of 1.2 percentage points and 0.4 percentage point, respectively.
