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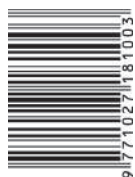

WILL TRANSNAMIB'S N\$2.6-B TURNAROUND LOANS DELIVER?

NAMIBIA'S AILING RAIL UTILITY HAS SECURED LOANS FROM THE DEVELOPMENT BANKS OF NAMIBIA AND OF SOUTHERN AFRICA TO EXPAND ITS LOCOMOTIVE AND ROLLING STOCK FLEET WITH WHICH TO RESUSCITATE ITS CARGO CARRYING CAPACITY, BUT HAS A POOR RECORD OF TRANSPARENT PUBLIC PROCUREMENT THROUGH WHICH TO IMPLEMENT ITS AMBITIOUS AGENDA - PAGE 5

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Within 2024/25's N\$1.048-b OEMP budget, 33.37% is channeled through the development budget, higher than 29.3% of last year's revised expenditure and 25% of 2022/23's actual spending – a consistent increase.

Despite a 4% reduction in Namibia's national budget for operational equipment, machinery and plant to N\$1.05-b in 2024/25, two thirds is being spent on military hardware – nine times more than what has been set aside for bulk water supply amidst the devastating drought, and over four times more than the funds voted for medical technology in under-resourced state healthcare facilities, which has been reduced by 30%, compared to the defence ministry's 11.6% increase.

As noted earlier (*Bulletin 1543*), although Namibia's central government has increased its procurement budget by 22% to a ten-year high of N\$13.5-b in 2024/25, of which the N\$8-b set aside for consumable materials, general services and expenses is over 14% more than last year, while the N\$1.05-b to be invested in operational equipment, machinery and plant (OEMP) is almost 5% less.

This year's procurement budget includes a disappointing 4.34% de-

crease in the acquisition of operational equipment, machinery and plant to N\$1.05-b on last year's N\$1.1-b revised expenditure, accounting for 7.7% of the N\$13.5-b procurement total in 2024/25 compared to last year's 9.9% of revised N\$11-b procurement expenditure.

And despite this reduction in the OEMP budget in 2024/25, the defence ministry's allocation has been increased by 11.6%, as a result of which its 62.23% share of the N\$1.048-b total is significantly more than its 53.34% of last year's N\$1.096-b revised OEMP expenditure – although less than its 72.28% share of 2022/23's N\$771-m overall actual spending.

On the other hand, the health ministry's OEMP allocation this year is 29.7% less than last year, its share of the OEMP budget falling to 14.34% from last year's 19.5% of revised expenditure – although it is higher than 2022/23's 11.5% share of actual OEMP expenditure.

The Agriculture & Land Reform Vote's OEMP ceiling has also been reduced by almost 12% in 2024/25, its

share of the budget falling to 4.48% from last year's 4.87% of revised expenditure – although it is much higher than 0.7% of 2022/23's actual spending.

OEMP spending in the procurement budget

The N\$1.09-b revised spending on operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2023/24 was the highest in the past eight years and accounted for 9.9% of N\$11-b procurement expenditure as the fourth-biggest procurement spending head, as is the case this year.

This followed a massive 42.2% or N\$325.337-m increase over 2022/23's N\$771-m actual OEMP expenditure – far less than N\$813.8-m voted at the beginning of that year, when it accounted for a lower 8.8% of the N\$10.33-b procurement total – also ranked fourth.

In 2021/22, actual OEMP expenditure totaling N\$714-m was far below the N\$1-b voted at the beginning of the year – consistent with the endemic midyear diversion of funds earmarked for capital expenditure into current expenditure. N\$714-m actual OEMP expenditure

in 2021/22 was 15.5% or N\$131-m below 2020/21's N\$845.4-m, which in turn, was 4.3% or N\$38-m less than 2019/20's N\$883.46-m actual OEMP expenditure.

In 2020/21, actual OEMP expenditure totaled N\$845.4-m, equating to 7.68% out of total N\$11.15-b procurement expenditure, compared to 2019/20, when actual OEMP expenditure of N\$883.46-m accounted for a much higher 9.4% of the N\$9.36-b procurement total.

In addition, the disparities between capital expenditure on operational equipment, machinery and plant by the defence force compared to the health ministry and the agriculture/water sectors widened in 2022/23 in favour of the Ministry of Defence.

Military hardware versus health technology

In addition to the disparity between the defence and health ministries' OEMP allocation highlighted above for this year, the defence vote's share of over half of 2023/24's revised OEMP expenditure was six times that of the health ministry's N\$88.73-m and almost

seventeen times that of the agriculture and water vote's N\$38.3-m.

At the beginning of 2023/24, the Defence Vote's N\$573.8-m initial allocation was a little over ten times more than that of the agriculture and water votes combined compared to seventeen in revised expenditure) and almost treble what was voted initially for medical apparatus (compared to six times more in terms of revised expenditure).

The Defence Vote's N\$584.84-m revised OEMP expenditure in 2023/24 was more than its initial N\$573.84-m budget and accounted for 53.34% of the N\$1.09-b, and was 4.95% or N\$86.867-m more than its actual expenditure in 2022/23 when it accounted for a higher 72.28% share of the N\$771-m total.

The Defence Vote's revised OEMP spending in 2023/24 was 2.7 times more than the Health & Social Services Vote's N\$214-m, which accounted for 19.5% of the total, despite a huge 141% or N\$125.3-m increase on 2022/23's N\$88.7-m actual OEMP expenditure accounting for 11.5% of the total - far below its initial N\$234-m allocation, however, when it accounted for 25.77% of the total.

The N\$771-m actual OEMP expenditure in 2022/23 turned out to be significantly less than the N\$813.8-m voted at the beginning of 2022/23 - a reversal on 2021/22, when actual OEMP expenditure totaling N\$714-m was far below the N\$1-b voted at the beginning of that year, with the purchase of military hardware accounting for over 78% - outstripping expenditure on medical technology eight-fold.

Under-stocked state-owned hospitals were then bailed out by the private sector with donated ventilators and oxygen machines to save lives in midst of the deadly Covid-19 pandemic at the time.

While the national budget for the procurement of operational equipment, machinery and plant increased by 9.95% to N\$1-b in 2021/22, the defence vote's OEMP allocation still accounted for 74.4%, despite a 2.6% or N\$20.84-m decrease to N\$783.6-m from the previous year.

This was 8.4 times more than the Health & Social Services Vote's N\$93-m initial allocation at the beginning of 2021/22, following an unprecedented 82.15% or N\$41.98-m increase in its OEMP allocation from 2020/21's actual N\$51-m expenditure.

This disparity in the central government's spending priorities on operational equipment, machinery and plant was even worse in 2020/21 when the Defence Vote's N\$804.4-m OEMP expenditure was 15.7 times more than the health ministry's N\$51-m.

The Defence Vote's N\$804.4-m actual OEMP expenditure in 2020/21 was 10.96% or N\$79.47-m more than 2019/20's actual N\$725-m, whereas the Health & Social Services Vote's N\$51-m was 7.5% or N\$4.14-m less than 2019/20's N\$55.24-m actual expenditure on operational equipment, machinery and plant.

Defence versus agricultural and water equipment

Besides the disparity between spending on military hardware and medical technology within the OEMP budget, there are other imbalances in relation to the agriculture and water sectors, where operational equipment, machinery and plant play prominent developmental roles in contrast to military expenditure.

In addition to the disparities between the defence ministry's OEMP

budget this year and those of the water and agriculture votes referred to above, the combined N\$18.2-m revised expenditure by the agriculture and water votes in 2023/24 was far below their initial N\$54.35-m budget accounting for almost 5% of the total and turned out with a share of only 1.75% - over 1/30th of defence's N\$584.8-m with a 53.34% share - a deterioration on their one tenth proportion of the Defence Vote's initial N\$573.8-m budget with a 52.6% share.

The agriculture/water allocation for OEMP in 2023/24 was N\$26.67-m or 58% less than 2022/23's actual N\$45.87-m spending, compared to the N\$27.565-m or nearly 5% increase enjoyed by the Defence Vote compared to 2022/23's actual N\$557.275-m expenditure - also above its initial N\$552-m allocation.

In contrast, the agriculture and water votes spent only N\$45.87-m on OEMP in 2022/23 of their initial N\$70.5-m allocations.

These disparities are an improvement on 2021/22, when the combined N\$11.5-m or 1.56% share of N\$733.58-m actual OEMP expenditure of the agriculture and water votes was 45 times smaller than Defence's N\$499-m or 68% share.

Health & Social Services (Vote 13)'s N\$50.4-m OEMP budget for 2024/25 accounts for 14.34% of the total, following a 29.7% or N\$63.64-m reduction on last year's N\$214-m revised expenditure with a much higher 19.5% share.

Historical predominance of military hardware spending

The defence ministry's overwhelming dominance in Namibia's national expenditure on operational equipment, machinery and plant has become a regular feature in which the prioritization of military OEMP expenditure over that of the public health, agriculture and water supply sectors has escalated, reinforcing this counter-developmental tendency of recent years.

Over the past thirteen years from 2012/13, cumulative defence expenditure on operational equipment, machinery and plant totals N\$8.1-b or 68.5% of the N\$11.826-b spent overall:

- * N\$652.7-m of 2024/25's N\$1.048-b budget or 62.23%;
- * N\$584.84-m of 2023/24's N\$1.096-b revised expenditure or 53.34%;
- * N\$557.275-m - 72.28% of 2022/23's N\$771-m actual overall expenditure;
- * N\$499-m - 68% of 2021/22's N\$733.58-m total actual expenditure;
- * N\$804.4-m - 83.4% of the N\$964-m total in 2020/21;
- * N\$725-m - 82% of N\$883.45-m in 2019/20;
- * N\$677-m - 91.5% of N\$740-m in 2018/19;
- * N\$313-m - 63.5% of N\$493-m in 2017/18;
- * N\$410-m - 74% of N\$554-m in 2016/17;
- * N\$1.1-b - 76% of N\$1.45-b in 2015/16;
- * N\$1-b - 66.7% of N\$1.5-b in 2014/15;
- * N\$399-m - 49.8% of N\$801-m in 2013/14;
- * N\$378.7-m - 45% of N\$842-m in 2012/13.

Between 2013/14 and 2018/19, the Defence Vote's 45% share more than doubled to 91.5%, before declining over the following five years to 62.23% in 2024/25.

The procurement budget in 2024/25

As noted in earlier, although Namibia's central government has increased its procurement budget by 22% to a ten-year high of N\$13.5-b in 2024/25, this is the second consecutive year that the budget for construction - N\$3.2-b this year - is less than each of the allocations for

materials and supplies as well as for other services and expenses, both of which are heads of current expenditure mainly in the operational budget that do not add value.

Within this year's N\$13.495-b procurement budget spread across eight heads of expenditure:

- * N\$4.4-b has been voted for materials and supplies in 2024/25, accounting for the biggest, 32.8% of the total, following a N\$722.55-m or 19.6% increase on last year's revised N\$3.68-b expenditure when it accounted for 32.27% of N\$11-b - also the biggest and ahead of construction's N\$2.24-b with only 20%, in third place.
- * The N\$3.8-b set aside for other services and expenses accounts for 28% of the procurement total in second place and is 17% or N\$550.6-m more than last year's revised N\$3.25-b expenditure, when it accounted for 29.5% - also in second place and ahead of construction.
- * The N\$3.2-b voted for construction, renovations and improvements accounts for only 23.7% of the procurement budget in third place amongst eight procurement heads of expenditure and has been surpluses in eight of the past twelve years, despite a 42.45% or N\$951.7-m increase over last year's N\$2.24-b when it accounted for only 20%

N\$42.7-m or 27.5% increase over last year's revised N\$155-m expenditure.

* N\$68.265-m has been voted for the purchase of buildings, accounting for 0.5% of the procurement total in its traditional eighth and last place, following a colossal N\$64.265-m or 1.606% increase on last year's N\$4-m expenditure - double the N\$2-m initially voted.

Development OEMP expenditure

Within 2024/25's N\$1.048-b OEMP budget, N\$349.7-m or 33.37% is channeled through the development budget, higher than the 29.3% or N\$321.2-m of last year's N\$1.096-b revised expenditure and 25% or N\$196-m of 2022/23's N\$771-m actual OEMP spending - a consistent increase.

The development OEMP budget in 2024/25 is 8.87% higher than last year's N\$321.2-m revised expenditure, compared to the 9.8% decrease in the N\$699-m OEMP ceiling channeled through the operational budget this year compared to last year's revised N\$775-m expenditure.

Between 2022/23's actual OEMP expenditure and last year's revised spending, the development component increased by 63.77% from N\$196-m to N\$321.2-m, while the operational budget component also rose - from N\$575-m to N\$775-m, but by a much lower 34.78%.

Before that, it was different. In terms of 2021/22's N\$714-m actual OEMP expenditure, 82% or N\$585.86-m was operational capex and only 18% or N\$128-m development.

Of 2020/21's N\$845-m expenditure on operational equipment, machinery and plant, only 21.6% or N\$182.6 was channeled through the development budget, with 78.4% or N\$662.8-m classified as operational capex.

This translated into a 23% decline in the development component from 2019/20's actual N\$237-m expenditure, compared to a 2.6% increase from 2019/20's actual N\$646-m operational capex on OEMP.

The composition of 2019/20's OEMP expenditure translated into 26.8% development and 73.2% operational capex.

Votes with development OEMP allocations

Of the eleven votes with OEMP budgets in 2024/25, eight have part of their allocations channeled through the development budget, compared to seven out of twelve last year, six out of eleven in 2022/23, nine out of fourteen in 2021/22 and seven out of fourteen in each of the previous two years.

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With this year's general elections only four months away, Information & Communication Technology has the third-biggest OEMP allocation of N\$80-m in 2024/25 accounting for 7.6% of the total, following a generous 29% or N\$18-m increase on last year's N\$62-m revised expenditure with a 5.66% share.

Agriculture & Land Reform has the fourth-biggest budget for operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2024/25, with N\$46.98-m accounting for 4.48%, following an 11.94% reduction on last year's N\$53.35-m revised expenditure with a 4.87% share.

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As was the case in the previous two years, Defence is the only vote with a smaller development OEMP component than its operational capex allocation, while the development components of the rest all exceed their operational components – in most cases comprising most, if not all, of their OEMP ceilings – largely a repeat of the previous two years.

* 97.5% or N\$8-m of the Presidency's N\$8.2-m in 2024/25 is defined as 'development', compared to N\$5-m of its N\$5.2-m revised expenditure last year (from N\$3-m out of N\$3.2-m voted initially). N\$12.765-m of its N\$12.876-m actual expenditure in 2022/23 went through the development budget – a drastic turnaround from the beginning of that year when all of only N\$500,000 initially voted was supposed to have been operational capex.

This is after N\$16.3-m of its N\$17.7-m original OEMP ceiling in 2021/22 was classified as development, before evaporating into only N\$1.378-m actual operational expenditure, with its entire development component wiped out.

* N\$150-m or 23% of the Defence Vote's N\$652.708-m OEMP budget is defined as 'development', compared to N\$131 or 22.4% of its N\$584.84-m revised expenditure in 2023/24 – up from N\$120-m initially voted.

This is comparable to 2022/23's actual expenditure when N\$110.4-m of its N\$557.275-m (up from N\$552-m) or a lower 19.8% was channeled through the development budget.

This is in line with 2021/22, when N\$150-m or 19% of its initial N\$783.6-m ceiling (later reduced to N\$573.6-m total expenditure), of which N\$150-m was still channeled through the development budget, with only its operational allocation reduced to N\$423.6-m. In relative terms, this means its development component rose to 35.4%.

* N\$7.245-m or 90.5% of Environment, Forestry & Tourism's N\$8-m OEMP budget in 2024/25 is defined as 'development', compared to last year when N\$11-m or 97.5% of its N\$11.28-m revised expenditure was channeled through the development budget.

This is comparable to 2022/23 when N\$6.75-m of N\$6.9-m actual expenditure or 98% was within the development budget, compared to N\$7.25-m of N\$7.4-m actual expenditure in 2021/22 – 98%.

* N\$34-m or 98% of the Transport Vote's N\$34.7-m OEMP budget in 2024/25 is channeled through the development budget, compared to

N\$47.4-m or 98% of its N\$48.2-m revised expenditure last year. None of its mere N\$178,000 actual OEMP expenditure in 2022/23 was defined as development, compared to an initial N\$3-m or 77% of its N\$3.895-m was supposed to be channeled through the development budget, following no OEMP development expenditure in 2021/22 out of N\$1.212-m.

This amounted to a major cutback from what it started with in 2021/22, when N\$35-m of its N\$36.45-m or 96% was designated as development.

* Information & Broadcasting's entire N\$80-m OEMP budget this year is regarded as 'development', compared to all of its N\$62-m revised expenditure in 2023/24 – down from N\$82-m that was also all designated as 'development'.

Its N\$30.445-m actual expenditure in 2022/23 consisted of 98.7% or N\$27-m development expenditure, which was supposed to be its entire OEMP budget for that year. All its N\$2-m actual expenditure in 2021/22 was also channeled through the development budget – a far cry from what it started the year with, when all N\$58-m of its OEMP allocation was classified as development.

* Similarly, all of Agriculture & Land Reform's N\$46.98-m OEMP budget this

Ranked fifth, the Transport Vote has N\$34.7-m to spend on operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2024/25, accounting for 3.3% of the total, following a 28% reduction on last year's N\$48.2-m revised spending with a 4.4% share.

year is designated as 'development', as was the case in 2023/24 when all its N\$53.35-m revised OEMP expenditure went through the development budget.

Similarly, its entire N\$5.45-m actual OEMP spending in 2022/23 was designated as development – drastically reduced from its N\$41.3-m budget for that year, with all N\$32.43-m of its actual expenditure in 2021/22 also going through the development budget.

* All of the Water Vote's N\$22.5-m OEMP budget in 2024/25 is being channeled through the development budget, as was all its N\$10.8-m revised spending last year – up from only N\$1-m initially voted, all of which was also 'development'.

Its entire N\$32.84-m actual OEMP expenditure in 2022/23 also all went through the development budget, as was the case with 2021/22's N\$325,000 actual expenditure.

* Bucking the trend, only N\$1-m or 4.47% of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security's N\$22.37-m OEMP budget in 2024/25 is designed as de-

velopment, compared to none of last year's revised expenditure of N\$8.4-m and none of 2022/23's N\$13-m actual OEMP spending – a whole lot more than the mere N\$600,000 initially voted only through the operational budget, compared to 2021/22's actual N\$8.5-m development OEMP expenditure, which comprised 67% of its N\$12.738-m actual spending.

This was a lot more than what it started 2021/22 with, when N\$8.5-m of its N\$13-m OEMP initial allocation was considered as development expenditure – 65.4%.

From the above, the trend has been for OEMP development expenditure to turn out less than initially budgeted, unlike the case with operational OEMP capex – the result of annual midyear diversions of successive development budgets into operational expenditure ceilings.

In 2020/21, six out of eight votes had more of their OEMP ceilings channeled through the development budget than through their operational allocations – except for Safety & Security and Defence.

In 2019/20, seven out of fourteen votes had development components in their OEMP allocations, of which all but one was more than their operational expenditure.

that year and which was not revised midyear – amounting to a technical over-expenditure.

Operational equipment, machinery and plant acquired by the Defence Force translates mostly into military hardware, while for other ministries these assets translate into inputs for public health facilities, agriculture, water supply, power generation, etc.

The Ministry of Defence's share of funding for operational plant, machinery and equipment continues to outstrip by far that of all other votes combined – including that of bulk water supply in the midst of devastating water shortages that are constraining economic development.

The Defence Vote's 91.5% share of all OEMP spending in 2018/19 was historically the biggest – at the worst possible time in the midst of unprecedented economic recession and national water shortages.

While 2018/19's original global OEMP spending increased 50.5% on 2017/18, the Defence Vote's funding increased by more than twice that – 116%.

Some of the Defence Vote's OEMP budget this year and previous expenditure is – questionably – defined as 'development' (see above).

Health & Social Services

In a distant second place behind Defence, Health & Social Services (Vote 13)'s N\$50.4-m OEMP budget for 2024/25 accounts for 14.34% of the total, following a 29.7% or N\$63.64-m reduction on last year's N\$214-m revised expenditure with a much higher 19.5% share.

This is the same as its initial allocation at the start of 2023/24 and was over 141% or N\$125.3-m more than its N\$88.73-m actual spending in 2022/23 when it accounted for only 11.5% of the total.

Its midyear revised N\$234.2-m budget for OEMP had been considerably higher also than its initial allocation of N\$139.235-m, following a generous 50.38% or N\$46.645-m increase on its actual N\$92.6-m expenditure in 2021/22, when it accounted for a lesser 12.6% of the total.

Its actual OEMP expenditure in 2021/22 had been on par with its N\$93-m allocation at the beginning of the year, which had been a massive 82% or N\$42-m boost on the previous year.

Vote 13's 2020/21 actual expenditure, accounting for 5.3% of the N\$964-m OEMP total was 7.5% or N\$4.14-m less than 2019/20's N\$55.24-m when it accounted for 6.25% of the N\$884.46-m OEMP total – all in second place behind Defence.

It is rather peculiar that all health's OEMP allocation is channeled through the operational budget (as has always been the case), in contrast to the Defence Vote, where a considerable portion of its OEMP expenditure is classified as 'development'.

And although Health & Social Services retained its N\$60.2-m to spend on operational equipment, machinery and plant at the time of 2019/20's midyear revisions in fourth place, this was reduced to N\$55.2-m actual expenditure.

Given the price tag on hi-tech medical equipment, Vote 13's OEMP budget continues to be untenable and unsustainable, despite 2021/22's much higher expenditure – that still had to be augmented by private sector inputs to save lives with oxygen machines and ventilators in the face of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The exception was again the Defence Vote, where it is tenuous to justify defence spending on operational equipment, machinery and plant as 'development', except in a very narrow technical sense.

Of the eleven votes with OEMP allocations in 2024/25, eight each account for over 1% of the total, compared seven out of last year's twelve, six out of eleven in 2022/23 and five out of twelve in 2021/22.

Defence

Defence (Vote 8)'s N\$652.7-m OEMP ceiling in 2024/25 accounts for 62.23% of the N\$1.048-b total, following a N\$67.867-m or 11.6% increase on last year's N\$584.84-m revised expenditure accounting for 53.34% of the N\$1.096-b total.

This was more than its initial N\$573.84-m ceiling in 2023/24 and was 4.95% or N\$27.565-m more than its N\$557.275-m actual OEMP spending in 2022/23 with a 72.28% share of the N\$771-m total.

Its actual expenditure in 2022/23 was also more than its N\$552-m allocation, and 3.78% or N\$21.7-m less than its N\$573.6-m actual expenditure in 2021/22 when it accounted for an even higher 78.2% share of the N\$733.58-m total.

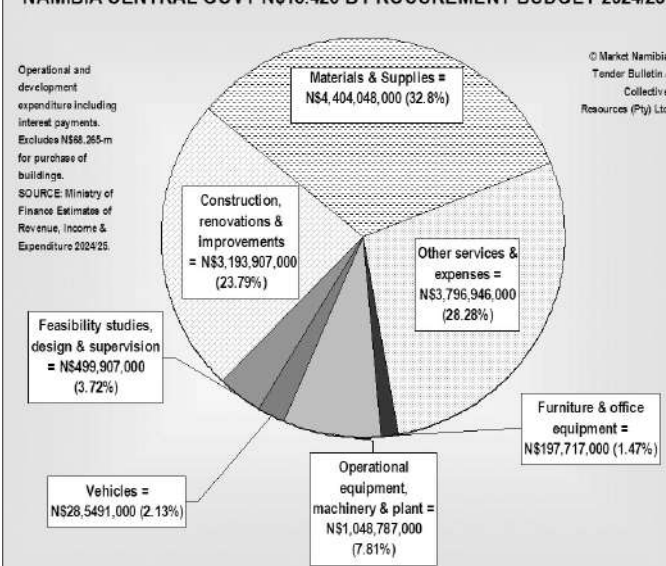
Defence's N\$573.6-m actual OEMP expenditure in 2021/22 had been considerably less than the N\$783.6-m with which it started that year, when it accounted for 74.4% of the N\$1.053-b total at the time, following a N\$20.8-m or 2.6% decrease on 2020/21's actual N\$804.4-m OEMP expenditure when it accounted for an even higher 83.4% of the N\$964-m total.

Defence's actual OEMP expenditure in 2020/21 was 11% more than its N\$725-m expenditure in 2019/20, when it accounted for 82% of the N\$883.46-m total.

This N\$725-m actual expenditure in 2019/20 was N\$20-m more than its N\$705-m allocation at the beginning of

Information & Communication Technology

With this year's general elections only four months away, Vote 29 has the third-biggest OEMP allocation of N\$80-m in 2024/25, accounting for 7.6% of the total, following a generous 29% or N\$18-m increase on last year's N\$62-m revised expenditure with a 5.66% share in fourth place – lower than the N\$82-m budget which it started 2023/24.

Its revised OEMP spending last year was a huge 103.64% or N\$31.55-m increase on 2022/23's N\$30.445-m actual expenditure with a 3.95% share.

This, in turn, had been more than its N\$27-m initial allocation in 2022/23 in fifth place.

This followed a remarkable 1,250% or N\$25-m increase on 2021/22's actual N\$2-m expenditure accounting for a mere 0.27% of the total – its first OEMP budget in nine years.

This N\$2-m actual expenditure in 2021/22 was far below its initial N\$58-m OEMP allocation at the start of that year, which came out of the blue and was all classified as 'development' spending.

Nine years earlier, Vote 29's last recorded OEMP expenditure was N\$27.85-m 2012/13, accounting for 3.2% of the N\$841.87-m total – also all channeled through the development budget, which is again the case in 2024/25 (see above).

Aside from all its expenditure inappropriately defined as 'development' year after year, it is also noteworthy that Vote 29's OEMP budget this year – on the eve of general elections – outstrips the combined ceiling of the agriculture and water votes – as it did last year.

Agriculture & Land Reform

Established in 2020/21, Agriculture & Land Reform (Vote 37) has the fourth-biggest budget for operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2024/25, with N\$46.98-m accounting for 4.48%, following an 11.94% or N\$6.368-m reduction on last year's N\$53.35-m revised expenditure with a 4.87% share in fifth place.

This is the same as its initial allocation in 2023/24, following a colossal 878.5% or N\$47.9-m increase over its N\$5.45-m actual spending in 2022/23 when it accounted for only 0.7% of the total.

This, in turn, was far less than its initial allocation at the beginning of 2022/23.

All Vote 37's OEMP allocation this year is channeled through the development budget, as was the case over the previous two years (see above).

Vote 37's actual OEMP spending in 2022/23 followed 27% or N\$8.86-m increase over 2020/21's actual N\$32.43-m expenditure, accounting for 4.4% of the total – also all went through the development budget and was below its initial N\$39.6-m allocation in 2021/22.

This, in turn, had been a disappointing N\$13.266-m or 25% reduction on 2020/21's N\$52.9-m when it accounted for 5.5% of the N\$964-m total in third place – all of which was channeled through the development budget.

Vote 37's original OEMP ceiling then was a remarkable 341.6% or N\$41-m increase on the latest N\$11.8-m recorded for its predecessor Vote 20 - Agriculture, Water & Forestry - in 2019/20 (now discontinued).

Considering it will cost an estimated N\$2-b to pipe water from the north to Windhoek in order to stave off a water crisis in the capital in the medium term, the combined OEMP budgets of the

agriculture and water votes are grossly inadequate and would be considerably bolstered if they had access to the Defence Vote's inordinate share.

Transport

Ranked fifth, Vote 24 has N\$34.7-m to spend on operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2024/25, accounting for 3.3% of the total, following a 28% or N\$13.5-m reduction on last year's N\$48.2-m revised spending with a 4.4% share in sixth place.

This is the same as its initial allocation in 2023/24 and was N\$48-m or a humongous 2,700% more than Vote 24's mere N\$178,000 actual OEMP spending in 2022/23 with only a 0.02% share of the total.

This actual expenditure in 2022/23 was far less than its N\$4-m with which it started, following a N\$2.8-m or over 231% increase on 2021/22's N\$1.2-m actual expenditure.

This, in turn, had been drastically short of its N\$36.45-m allocation at the beginning of 2021/22, accounting for 3.46% of the N\$1-b OEMP total in fifth place at the time – 96% of which was designated as development expenditure, but which never materialized.

This is had been an astonishing 2,371% increase on 2020/21's N\$1.475-m actual OEMP expenditure when it accounted for only 0.15% of the N\$964-m total – all classified as operational capex.

Its pitiful N\$1.475-m OEMP expenditure in 2020/21 was 90% or N\$13.3-m less than 2019/20's actual N\$14.76-m, of which N\$13.8-m or 93.5% was development expenditure.

Virtually all the Transport Vote's OEMP budget in 2024/25 is channeled through the development budget (see above).

Water

Vote 38 has an OEMP budget of N\$22.5-m in 2024/25 in sixth place, accounting for 2.15% of the total following a 108% or N\$11.7-m increase over last year's N\$10.8-m revised expenditure with a share of only 0.99% in an undeserved eleventh and second-last place.

Its revised spending last year was considerably more than the mere N\$1-m with which it started but was 67% or N\$22-m less than 2022/23's N\$32.84-m actual expenditure with a 4.26% share in fourth place.

This, in turn, had been slightly more than the N\$29.2-m with which it started in 2022/23, following a mind-boggling 8,884% or N\$28.875-m increase over 2021/22's actual expenditure of a ludicrous N\$325,000 – 0.04% of the total.

Its negligible N\$325,000 expenditure in 2021/22 was 71% or N\$795,000 less than 2020/21's N\$1.12-m when it was created as a separate vote – all of which was also development expenditure.

All of Vote 38's OEMP budget in 2024/25 and the previous three years is designated as development (see above).

Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security

Created in 2021/22, Vote 39 has an OEMP allocation of N\$22.37-m in 2024/25 in seventh place, accounting for 2.13% of the total following a most generous 166.4% or almost N\$14-m increase on its N\$8.4-m revised expenditure last year with a 0.77% share ranked eighth.

This was more than its initial N\$6-m budget in 2023/24 and was 35.56% or

Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety & Security has an OEMP allocation of N\$22.37-m in 2024/25 in seventh place, accounting for 2.13% of the total following a most generous 166.4% increase on its N\$8.4-m revised expenditure last year with only a 0.77% share.

N\$4.6-m less than its N\$13-m actual OEMP spending through the operational budget in 2022/23 when it accounted for 1.7% of the total also ranked eighth.

Vote 39's actual OEMP expenditure in 2022/23 turned out a lot higher than its N\$600,000 initial allocation – all through the operational budget.

Vote 37 spent N\$12.738-m on operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2021/22, N8.5-m of which was channeled through the development budget.

The new consolidated vote's OEMP allocation in 2021/22 was 55.5% more than 2020/21's N\$8.36-m actual expenditure by its predecessors - Home Affairs & Immigration (Vote 5) with N\$400,000 and Safety & Security (Vote 6) with N\$8-m.

This N\$8.36-m expenditure in 2020/21 was 67% more than 2019/20's actual OEMP expenditure – N\$292,354 for Home Affairs plus N\$4.757-m for Safety & Security.

After three years of no funding (we were led to believe), the now-discontinued Safety & Security Vote had N\$5.163-m to spend on OEMP at the beginning of 2019/20, but of which only N\$4.76-m was actually spent.

For the first time in the past three years, some of Vote 39's OEMP budget in 2024/25 is designated as development (see above).

Electoral Commission

With general elections only four months away, the Electoral Commission (Vote 28) has N\$22.2-m to spend on operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2024/25, ranked eighth and last of the votes with over 1% of the total.

It accounts for 2.12% of the overall N\$1.048-b OEMP budget, following a 76.36% or N\$71.7-m reduction on 2023/24's almost N\$94-m revised spending when it accounted for a much higher 8.56% of the total in third place.

This is the same as its OEMP ceiling last year, which was 331% or N\$72-m more than its N\$21.8-m actual expenditure in 2022/23 with a 2.8% share in sixth place.

This, in turn, was well above its N\$13.045-m allocation at the beginning of that year.

The Electoral Commission had no OEMP budget in 2021/22, but spent N\$5.87-m in 2020/21, which had been a 1,577% or N\$5.52-m increase over 2019/20's negligible N\$350,000 actual expenditure.

That leaves three votes with OEMP allocations in 2024/25 below 1% each.

The Presidency

In the same ninth place, the Office of the President (Vote 1) has an OEMP allocation of N\$8.2-m accounting for 0.78%, following a 57.7% or N\$3-m increase on 2023/24's N\$5.2-m expenditure accounting for 0.47% - slightly below its N\$3.2-m ceiling and almost 60% or N\$7.676-m less than 2022/23's N\$12.876-m actual OEMP expenditure with a higher 1.67% share.

This turned out to be conveniently more than its N\$500,000 initial allocation, following a 63.7% or N\$878,000 reduction on 2021/22's actual N\$1.378-m OEMP expenditure, which was drastically short of the N\$17.7-m with which it started the year - 92% of which was classified as 'development' expenditure.

This, in turn, had been 8.4% or N\$1.6-m less than 2020/21's N\$19.3-m actual expenditure when it accounted for 2% of the N\$964-m OEMP total in fourth place, N\$16.3-m of which was also classified as 'development'.

Vote 1's N\$19.3-m OEMP expenditure in 2020/21 was 68.8% or N\$42.66-m below 2019/20's actual N\$62-m with

the second-biggest share – all development expenditure.

What the Namibian Central Intelligence Service resorting under the Presidency did with all that technology – most of it dressed up as 'development' - is anyone's guess.

It is some consolation that the Presidency is ranked behind the health and agriculture votes in the distribution funding for operational equipment, machinery and plant in 2024/25 - as has been the case over previous four years.

Most of the Presidency's OEMP budget in 2024/25 is again defined as development (see above).

Environment, Forestry & Tourism

With forestry added to its governance portfolio in 2020/21, Vote 18 has an OEMP budget of N\$8-m in 2024/25, accounting for 0.76% in tenth place, following a N\$3.276-m or 29% reduction on last year's N\$11.3-m revised spending with a 1.03% share in seventh place.

This is the same as its 2023/24 ceiling, which was almost N\$4.4-m or 63.5% more than its actual expenditure of almost N\$7-m in 2022/23 with a 0.89% share also ranked seventh.

Works

Ranked eleventh and last, Vote 23 has an OEMP budget of only N\$709,000 in 2024/25 – not much different from its N\$697,000 revised expenditure last year in twelfth and last place.

This was unchanged from its initial allocation and over 19% more than its N\$584,000 actual spending in 2022/23 with a 0.06% share.

WILL TRANSNAMIB'S N\$2.6-B TURNAROUND PLAN DELIVER?

9 AUGUST 2024

N\$2.6-b loans from the Development Bank of Namibia and the Development Bank of Southern Africa announced by TransNamib last month, will enable the national rail operator to effectively address its locomotive capacity challenges, according to its CEO, Desmond van Jaarsveld.

TransNamib intends to repay the loan within five years "through improved efficiency and an increased customer base".

The CEO explained that the conditions of the loans stipulate that the funds must strictly be used to increase TransNamib's capacity. "For years we have been transparent about the challenges posed by our outdated equipment.

The loan will be used specifically for the remanufacturing of rolling stock, modernization of the TransNamib workshop and upgrading of signaling equipment, including spares and associated equipment. "This loan will not only enable us to increase our capacity but also address safety concerns related to our aged equipment," he said.

The procurement of new locomotives and multi-purpose rail wagons will commence soon with an anticipated lead time of 24 months, according to a TransNamib statement.

With this loan facility, TransNamib could now effect real change: "We have spent the past five years securing the loan and meeting the necessary conditions to access this funding. Now we are finally in a position to implement our strategy to transform the company," the CEO said.

TransNamib is planning a new signaling system for the entire rail network to increase safety and line capacity with the primary focus on the busy routes leading to Namibia's ports.

A statement issued by TransNamib spokesperson, Abigail Raubenheimer, mentioned that the funding arrived at an exciting time, since the upgrading of railway infrastructure was a priority in Namibia.

In addition to procuring new rolling stock and equipment, the construction of the new railway line between Kranzberg and Otjiwarongo will commence towards the end of 2024, a project undertaken by the Ministry of Works & Transport. During a follow-up phase, the new railway line will be extended to Tsumeb.

Botswana in a hurry for Trans-Kalahari Railway

During a three-day state visit to Namibia in early July, President Mokgweetsi Masisi of Botswana called for urgent action to address pending matters to expedite the implementation of the Trans-Kalahari Railway Project - a 1,500km railway line from Mmamabula in Botswana along the Trans-Kalahari highway through the Mamuno Border Post into Namibia and then via Gobabis, Windhoek and Okahandja to Walvis Bay.

Speaking during a recent forum for public enterprises CEOs, van Jaarsveld confirmed that the ministers of both countries had recently signed off the timeline for the bilateral railway project. In Namibia "we need to focus on regional integration; rail needs to work together with road transport. We don't want to eliminate the trucks. In fact, the inter-modal opportunities are vital for us," the CEO added.

Van Jaarsveld admitted that the national rail operator currently only transports 14% of the total fuel requirements of the country. He also acknowledged that TransNamib was failing to service customers sufficiently and needed to improve to become relevant again.

"TransNamib's mandate is to maintain the railway and ensure that we have fit-for-purpose rolling stock, which is currently not the case".

TransNamib's oldest locomotive is 53-years old (*Die Republikein, The Namibian 05-Jul-24; New Era 08 & 10-Jul-24; Namibia Sun 09-Jul-24*).

Namibia's ailing rail utility has secured loans from the development banks of Namibia and of Southern Africa to expand its locomotive and rolling stock fleet with which to resuscitate its cargo capacity, but has a poor record of transparent public procurement through which to implement such an ambitious agenda

More locos and rolling stock

A report by the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Economics & Public Administration in April recommended that TransNamib should exclusively transport dangerous goods and heavy freight. To regain profitability TransNamib needs to address challenges related to competing with road transport.

Due to emerging oil, gas and green hydrogen markets, it was essential for the government to ensure sufficient investment in the railway sector so that the transportation corridors are operational at full capacity, the committee found. It requested the government to favorably consider the N\$2.6-b loan to support the acquisition of 20 to 25 locomotives, re-manufacturing of 10 locomotives, purchase of 300 wagons and tankers, upgrading workshops and equipment and providing the necessary training, according to the report (*Namibian Sun 25-Apr-24*).

Five-year business turnaround advisory services

After approving a loan facility of N\$500-m towards the implementation of TransNamib Holdings Limited's 2022-2027 Integrated Strategic Business Plan (ISBP), the Development Bank of Namibia wasted no time in issuing an Expression of Interest on 01-Jul-24 for advisory management services to enable the Bank to draw up the terms of reference for the Business Turn-Around Advisor (BTA) services.

Tender SC/EOI/DBN-01/2024 for business turn-around advisory services "for a national rail operator in Namibia" was supposed to close on 19-Jul-24, but was extended on 22-Jul-24 to 26-Jul-24. The consultancy was advertised in two local newspapers and listed in the *Tender Bulletin*.

The DBN funding approval included the appointment of a BTA to assist the Bank in reviewing the operational and technical efficiency, right skills set and human resources capacity.

The scope of services for the EOI states that the lender requires the services of an independent business turn-around advisor to assist with aspects of the implementation of the TransNamib ISBP.

The BTA's duty will be solely to the lender, to provide in-depth review and advice, including operations efficiency procurement processes, related technical excellence aspects, maintenance and skills development plans.

The 'project background' in the EOI mentions that TransNamib requirements in the short-term are to increase rolling stock capacity and reliability by investing in new enabling technology, capacitating the workshop depot and refurbishing locomotives. In the medium- to long-term, critical investment will include replacing old locomotives and acquiring new assets.

Based on the EOI responses received, the DBN will draw up a short-list of consultants, which will receive the full Request for Proposal document.

As part of the EOI, consultants had to submit information in terms of Section 50(2) of the PPA 15 of 2015, as well as a comprehensive company profile with information on staff competencies and expertise plus comments and detailed modalities regarding the scope of services, with at least three relevant reference letters.

The BTA appointment will follow an open, competitive, transparent and international procurement process on behalf of the DBN and in accordance with applicable public finance management laws, the EOI document stated.

The maximum duration of the assignment is estimated to be five years.

WORK IN PROGRESS

(The EOI document was posted on the DBN website.)

Sluggish procurement with little transparency

TransNamib Holdings Namibia is not very transparent when it comes to its procurement processes. Hardly any bid opening reports, awards or executive summaries are posted on its website, which is only updated when new tenders are posted.

Despite TransNamib's prominence as a state entity, it does not post any new tenders or awards on the GRN eProcurement portal, where all state procurement is supposed to be visible.

According to the *Tender Bulletin* database, TransNamib has so far during 2024 publicly issued ten tenders, compared with eighteen in 2023 - including three EOIs. It issued ten tenders in 2022, only four in 2021, seven in 2020, fifteen in 2019 and eight in 2018.

These 62 tenders issued from 2018 to 2023 exclude 'restricted bidding' tenders that were not advertised.

Little award information

But only 23 tenders from 2018 to 2023 are currently listed under the Awards tab on the TNHL website, which has not changed for about a year. Only the procurement reference numbers, descriptions and the successful bidders are mentioned without any procurement values.

Of the eighteen tenders in 2023 only four were supposedly awarded:

- * Restricted Bidding tender W/RB/TNHL-02/2023 for the refurbishment of 32 rail wagon wheel sets - awarded to Surtees Railway Supplies;
- * NCS/RFQ/TNHL-15/2023 for locomotive tracking and other tracking services - awarded to M Two M Global Technologies - this bid was not on the *Tender Bulletin* database; the only related tender was EOI/TNHL-06/2023-24 to supply tracking equipment and management platform access for unpowered 2x wagons or tankers "that would like to try out as a proof of concept for period not less than 4 months" closing 07-Sep-23;
- * CS/RFQ/TNHL-04/2023 for the recruitment of a CEO - awarded to Capacity Trust. The *Tender Bulletin* has no record of this tender being advertised in public;
- * CS/RFQ/TNHL-02/2023 for lender Technical Advisory services to DBSA and DBN funding transaction to TNHL - awarded to Windhoek Consulting Engineers / Mondjila Project Advisory & Management JV. This is the only tender publicly advertised last year and closed on 13-May-23. It relates to the recently secured funding.

Only three open tenders

Under the Open Bids tab on TransNamib's website, the bid opening reports of only three tenders are visible on the website:

- * W/ONB/TNHL-11/2023-24: Supply, install, test and commission 11kV switchboard for diesel depot station in Windhoek closing 15-Sep-23 - prices were published in *Bulletin 1514*;
- * EOI/TNHL-08/2023-24: Rail access on the Ariamsvlei to Lüderitz rail line closing 03-Oct-23 - bidders' names were published in *Bulletin 1513*;
- * W/ONB/TNHL-12/2024-25: Debushing of the railway reserve - Okahandja to Windhoek closed 25-Jun-24 (bids published in *Bulletin 1551*).

Little bid evaluation info

The bid evaluations and their executive summaries of two older tenders are posted on the website:

- * G/ONB/TNHL-20/2021-22: Supply and deliver safety footwear (boots and tekkies) closed 06-Oct-21 and was awarded to Mukorob Uniforms and DDP Agencies - but this is not mentioned under the Awards tab;
- * G/OIB/TNHL-13/2022-23: Supply and deliver locomotive spares closed 01-Aug-22 and was awarded to Reelin Bearings according to the Awards tab.

Confusingly, another tab named 'Executive Summary' lists another three tenders from 2022, stating the bidders recommended for the award:

- * G/OIB/TNHL-09/2022-23: Supply and deliver 80x rail wagon wheel sets closed 03-Aug-22 and was awarded to SWASAP according to the Awards tab;
- * W/ONB/TNHL-08/2022-23: Construct reinforced concrete base for RAFAMET wheel lathe, incl. excavation and demolition of existing concrete structure (floor) closed 20-May-22 and was awarded to August 26 Construction according to the Awards tab;
- * G/OIB/TNHL-12/2022-23: Supply and deliver rail perway material closed 09-Aug-22 and was awarded to VAE / Luka Road Rails & Civil JV according to the Awards tab.

Under Bid Opening Reports only two tenders are listed:

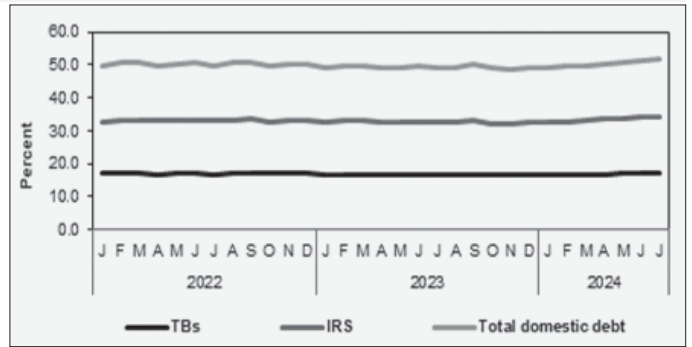
GRN'S DOMESTIC DEBT GROWS 10.2% TO N\$120.3-B

9 AUGUST 2024

Namibia's domestic government debt reached N\$120.3-b during July – 0.6% higher than the previous month and 10.2% year-on-year, according to

the Bank of Namibia's latest monthly report.

During the month in review, sales of Treasury Bills increased by 0.3% to N\$40.2-b, while new Internal Reg-

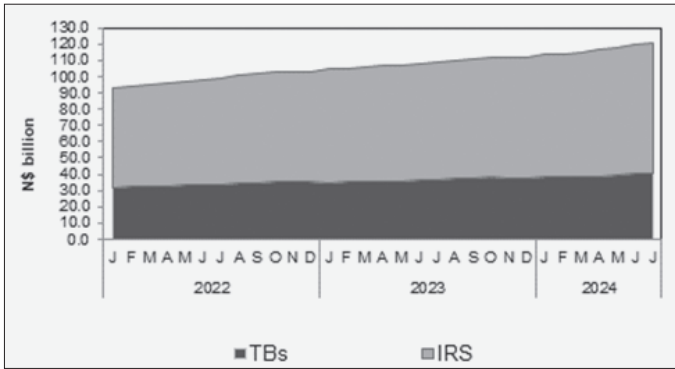


istered Stock issued rose by 0.8% to N\$80.1-b.

On an annual basis, the issuance of TBs increased by 9.1% and of IRS by 10.7%.

As percentage of GDP, domestic

debt increased by 0.3 percentage point month-on-month and by 2.6 percentage points annualized, to 51.6%, reflecting increased ratios of both IRSs and TBs to GDP of 1.9 percentage points and 0.7 percentage point respectively.

date for this obscure tender is officially still unknown. Yet four companies managed to

submit prices, according to the bid opening report, which lists their rates per kilometer:

- * Davos Logistics Solution = N\$16.10 - NaM-RA good standing not certified
- * Agility Logistics = N\$17.25
- * DCO Data Trading = N\$30.00
- * Noordoewer Trading = N\$32.20.
