

All of these elements are portrayed in abstract form serving as symbols or abstract physical elements existing within the world, which I am trying to show through my paintings.
















## K. VISHWANATHAN ARTIST

I come from a family of Artists, so the inclination and passion for Art came naturally to me. My brother particularly guided and influenced my thoughts during my growing years. Drawn towards Crafts paintings and sculpture. I set out very early in exploring and putting my ideas into reality. Kumbakonam the glorious temple town, adorned with beautiful ancient temples of Chola and Pallava era inspired and enriched my life. My schooling was near the Railway Station, Darasuram. I have vivid childhood memories of the time I spent in the Darasuram and Pattishwaram temples. Temples were places to study, meet and worship for us Learning and fun ran parallel. Later, I graduated in College of Arts & Crafts, Kumbakonam. I stood first for five years consecutively, won competitions and received a lot of awards. My formal education helped me to refine my art skills. A brief glimpse into my college days is worth mentioning here, as it brought unique experiences.











## HARISH KUMAR ARTIST

His earlier works landed him in the league of landscape painters as he explored the magnificence and grandeur of Indian palaces and monuments. Today he has crafted a niche for himself in the field of Art and is well known throughout India for his colourful pictorial essays on canvas.

Harish Kumar has progressed from landscapes, to figuration, depicting Gods and Demi-Gods. His love for capturing the spiritual harmony of man and God reflects in his portrayal of stories about the Hindu mythology, symbolisation of Krishna, Ganesha, Hanuman & Buddha.

The treatment of the picture surface is such that a rich texture quality is attained and each stroke makes a pleasantly overwhelming experience for the viewers. Kumar orchestrates his thoughts on canvas very sensitively. His painting explores the many shades of thoughts and ideas that transcend the human mind. Keeping the same rhythm and texture as his base, he mesmerises his viewer with geometrical language on the canvas through lines, boxes and beguile colour themes.

With an artistic career spanning over thirty years, Harish Kumar's work has been exhibited in major exhibitions and shows all over India and abroad. He has many solo and group participations to his name and his works are part of many esteemed private and public institutions all over India.















## RAJEEV KUMAR SCULPTOR

## SURYASNATA MOHANTY ARTIST

Suryasnata Mohanty is an accomplished contemporary artist, whose works have recently been shown in the India Art Architecture & Design Biennale 2023 at Red Fort, and in numerous prestigious group–shows at NGMA, Lalit Kala Akademi, Visual Arts Gallery, The Lalit, Salarjung Museum Hyderabad, Pracheen Kala Kendra Chandigarh, Tagore National Exhibition Bhopal etc, besides in two solo shows in Delhi. Her profile and works were featured in reputed art journal The Indian Creative Minds September 2022 issue.

Famously, the 'Kalash' (clay pot) painted by Suryasnata in a Lalit Kala Akademi camp for Amrit Kalash Mahotsav got selected and was held by Hon'ble PM of India Shri Narendra Modi to culminate the nationwide 'Meri Maati Mera Desh campaign at India Gate in New Delhi on 31 October 2023. Subsequently she became the first visual artist to receive the "Delhi Star Award 2023" in "The Innovator of the Year' category. She is also a recipient of "Rashtriya Rajat Samman of Kalavart Nyas, Ujjain, MP. during its Silver Jubilee International Art Camp in December 2023.


