The Mauritius Meteorological Services is soliciting Expressions of Interest (EOI) from qualified and experienced suppliers for the provision of a state-of-the-art storm surge and wave modeling system to serve the Republic of Mauritius, encompassing the islands of Mauritius, Rodrigues, St-Brandon and Agalega.

#### Background

The Republic of Mauritius consists of mainly four islands, namely Mauritius the main island and relatively smaller islands which consist of Rodrigues, St-Brandon and Agalega.

Being a volcanic island, Mauritius is situated roughly around 2000 km off the eastern coast of the African continent and lies between latitudes 19°58.80 and 20°31.70 south and longitudes 57°18.00 and 57°46.50 east. The island stretches for 65 km in length and 45 km in width, encompassing a total land area of 1865 km2. Its coastline spans approximately 330 km and are protected by coral reefs, which exhibit varying widths throughout the island. Particularly, the southwest and southeast coastal areas consist of wider reefs, measuring approximately 4 km in width. Conversely, towards the northeast and northwest part of the island, the coral reef becomes narrower, with a span of only a few hundred meters in width. While Agalega is located far to the North of Mauritius at about 1050km, Rodrigues and St-Brandon are closer to Mauritius, that is at around 560km to the East and 430 km to the North East respectively. The islands of the Republic of Mauritius experience two main seasons namely winter and summer. The summer season which lasts from November to April, is characterized by relatively weaker winds compared to the winter season. However, during this period, the islands are frequently affected by storm surge generated by tropical cyclones. On the other hand, during the winter season, the islands are very often affected by heavy swells which are generated by hydrometeorological hazards, transiting far to the islands.

Storm surges and high-impact wave events are critical threats to the coastal communities, ecosystems, and infrastructure of republic of Mauritius. According to the World Risk Report 2021, Mauritius has now become the 51<sup>st</sup> country with the highest disaster risk. The increasing
